Several attempts have been made by Mariners to find out a shorter passage to China by sailing to the North Pole, but without success; being forced back by the extremity of cold, and the thinness of the ice; so that many a number of English and French have perished in the attempt. The first enlarged being that some the Captain of the St. Peter and Paul, an English ship, was made to find out a passage over the North Coast of America; the first undertaker of these Voyages was Mr. Henry Sturgeson, who was afterwards followed by Mr. John Ross, out of whom made some very discoveries, but did not meet with the success they proposed.
